**NASCAR® Sprint Cup Crew Chief Alan Gustafson Wins
Federal-Mogul's MOOG® 'Problem Solver of the Year' Award**

*Prestigious Award Recognizes Crew Chief Who Delivers Most Consistent
Problem Solving Performance Throughout the Season*

Southfield, Michigan, November 21, 2011....Alan Gustafson, crew chief for Jeff Gordon and the No. 24 Drive to End Hunger Chevrolet, clinched the 2011 MOOG® "Problem Solver of the Year" Award during Sunday's Ford 400 NASCAR® Sprint Cup Series finale at Homestead-Miami (Fla.) Speedway. One of Sprint Cup racing's most prestigious honors, the year-end MOOG Problem Solver award is presented to the crew chief who delivers the most consistent problem solving performance throughout the season.

The MOOG Problem Solver of the Year Award and the weekly MOOG "Problem Solver of the Race" Award are sponsored by Federal-Mogul Corporation (NASDAQ: FDML), the global automotive components supplier and manufacturer of MOOG steering and suspension parts.

Gustafson led Sprint Cup crew chiefs with four weekly MOOG Problem Solver awards, which are presented to the crew chief whose car posts the highest increase in average lap speed over the second half of the race. Seven crew chiefs – Darian Grubb (#14 Chevrolet), Drew Blickensderfer (#6 Ford), Steve Letarte (#88 Chevrolet), Gil Martin (#29 Chevrolet), Bob Osborne (#99 Ford), Shane Wilson (#33 Chevrolet), and Paul Wolfe (#2 Dodge) – each had three MOOG Problem Solver of the Race Awards.

“Alan was consistently excellent on pit road this year. He made great calls in key races and did a remarkable job of maximizing the performance of the No. 24 car’s MOOG-equipped chassis,” said Michael Proud, director of marketing, North America, Federal-Mogul. “Our weekly and season-ending awards are all about having a feel for the racetrack and the car and making the precise steering and suspension adjustments necessary to come out on top. No one did that better than Alan in 2011.”

Gustafson will receive his MOOG Problem Solver of the Year trophy and a check for \$75,000 during the NASCAR NMPA Myers Brothers Awards Luncheon on December 1 in Las Vegas.

Weekly MOOG Problem Solver honors at Homestead-Miami were claimed by Lucas Lambert, crew chief for Jeff Burton and the MOOG-equipped No. 31 Caterpillar Chevrolet. The No. 31 car improved by a race-high 0.235-second-per-lap over the second half of the race to finish 10th.

“It was an exciting battle from start to finish this year and any one of six crew chiefs could have won it all on Sunday,” said Federal-Mogul Motorsports Director Tim Nelson. “MOOG steering and suspension parts help ensure world-class steering precision and handling on every track. This award honors the crew chiefs who are able to get even more out of their MOOG-equipped vehicles by dialing in their chassis setups to address changing track conditions.”
